## What and Why

- What?
  - Disadvantaged Business Program (DBE)
    - Certification Process <a href="https://dot.ca.gov/programs/civil-rights/dbe">https://dot.ca.gov/programs/civil-rights/dbe</a>
    - Eligibility Requirements 49 CFR Part 26
- Why?
  - SMART receives federal funds
  - Designed to do the following:
    - Ensure non-discrimination in DOT assisted contracts
    - Provide level playing field for DBEs to compete
    - Help remove barriers for DBEs
    - Assist in the development of DBEs to compete in all types of procurements



#### When?

Required to be updated every three (3) years

Based on a federal fiscal year (Oct. 1 – Sept. 30)

Needs to be updated more frequently if conditions change



#### How?

#### **DBE Goal Setting**

- Step 1 Identify federal funding over next 3 years
- Step 2 Identify the type of work to be performed
  - Use North American Industry Classification System (NAICS Codes)
- Step 3 Determine market area
  - Sonoma
  - Marin
  - Solano
  - Napa
  - Contra Costa



#### How?

#### **DBE Goal Setting**

- Step 4 Determine all firms in SMART's market area
  - Based on NAICS codes
- Step 5 Determine number of DBE's in SMART's market area
- Step 6 Determine availability
  - DBEs available in NAICS code/ All firms available in NAICS code

#### How?

#### **DBE Goal Setting**

- Step 7 Calculate Weighted Base Figure
  - % of Federal Funds by NAICS x Availability of DBEs by NAICS
  - Result 6.9%
- Step 8 Adjustment
  - Past Participation
  - 3.45%



#### Race-Neutral vs. Race-Conscious

- Race Neutral
  - Done through outreach efforts
- Race Conscious -
  - Set goals on solicitation
- SMART's goal is Race Neutral



## **Small Business Participation**

#### **Larger Focus**

- On larger contracts requiring bidders on the prime contract to specify elements of the contract or specific subcontracts that are of a size that small businesses can reasonably perform
- On prime contracts not having DBE contract goals, requiring the prime contractor to provide subcontracting opportunities of a size that small business, including DBEs can reasonably perform
- Ensuring that a reasonable number of prime contracts are of a size that small businesses, including DBEs, can reasonably perform

## Statement of Policy (Page 85 of Board Packet)

The Sonoma-Marin Area Rail Transit (SMART) has established a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program in accordance with regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), 49 CFR Part 26. SMART has received Federal financial assistance from the Department of Transportation, and as a condition of receiving this assistance, SMART has signed an assurance that it will comply with 49 CFR Part 26.

It is the policy of SMART to ensure that DBEs as defined in part 26, have an equal opportunity to receive and participate in DOT-assisted contracts. It is also our policy:

- a. To ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of DOT assisted contracts:
- b. To create a level playing field on which DBEs can compete fairly for DOT-assisted contracts;
- c. To ensure that the DBE Program is narrowly tailored in accordance with applicable law;
- d. To ensure that only firms that fully meet 49 CFR Part 26 eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs;
- e. To help remove barriers to the participation of DBEs in DOT assisted contracts;
- f. To promote the use of DBEs in all types of federally-assisted contracts and procurement activities conducted by SMART
- g. To assist the development of firms that can compete successfully in the marketplace outside the DBE Program.



## Statement of Policy (Continued)

Heather McKillop, Chief Financial Officer, has been delegated as the DBE Liaison Officer. In that capacity, Heather McKillop is responsible for implementing all aspects of the DBE program. Implementation of the DBE program is accorded the same priority as compliance with all other legal obligations incurred by SMART in its financial assistance agreements with the Department of Transportation.

SMART has disseminated this policy statement to the SMART Board of Directors and all the components of our organization. We have distributed this statement to DBE and non-DBE business communities that perform work for us on DOT- assisted contracts and is posted on our website: www.sonomamarintrain/business.org.
